## **REMOVAL/EXCLUSION OF PERSON(S) FROM COLLEGE FACILITIES**

Authority:	<ol> <li>College Public Safety officers have authority to ask a person for identification if such person is believed to be engaging in conduct that is in violation of college policy or procedure, is a violation of law, disrupts the operations of the college, or which poses a safety risk to themself or others.</li> <li>A person who refuses to identify himself or herself at the request of a Public Safety officer may be asked to leave college facilities.</li> <li>Failure to comply with a Public Safety officer's request to leave campus facilities subjects such person to the possibility of arrest for Criminal Trespass or issuance of a Trespass Warning.</li> </ol>
Employee:	1. An employee of the college who believes a person is engaging in activity that is in violation of college policy or procedure, a violation of law, or engaged in unusual or suspicious activity, should immediately contact the <b>Public Safety office</b> .
Public Safety Office:	<ol> <li>A Public Safety officer will investigate complaints, and request assistance if needed to appropriately resolve the situation.</li> <li>If the situation warrants exclusion or removal from college facilities, a college Public Safety officer may ask a person to leave college facilities and/or issue the person a Trespass Warning which provides notice that a subsequent return to campus facilities may result in an arrest for Criminal Trespass.</li> </ol>
Trespass Warning:	<ol> <li>The authority granted Public Safety officers to issue a Trespass Warning is used only in those instances where there is a clear violation of policy, procedure, or law.</li> <li>Criminal Trespass notices do not apply to individuals attending a public meeting of the College Board of Education, except for any meeting where the notice was issued due to disruptive behavior.</li> <li>Once a Trespass Warning has been issued, the recipient may schedule a meeting with the Public Safety director to request the Warning be rescinded.</li> </ol>

## REMOVAL/EXCLUSION OF PERSON(S) FROM COLLEGE FACILITIES (continued)

<b>Trespass Warning</b> (continued)		Based on the totality of the circumstances, the <b>Public Safety</b> <b>director</b> may rescind the warning and allow the person access to college facilities. If a person issued a Trespass Warning has not been the subject of a complaint or other inappropriate behavior on college property for a period of one year, the prohibition from trespassing on college property will be automatically rescinded.
	6.	In those instances where the recipient of a Trespass Warning is believed to pose a continuing threat to the safety and security of college operations, the Trespass Warning may continue indefinitely.
Outreach Campuses and All Locations Off Salem Main Campus:		The appropriate local law enforcement agency should be called for assistance to investigate a suspicious person or circumstance, or a violation of law. <b>Public Safety</b> may also be of assistance in interaction between local law enforcement and the college. If assistance is needed for a violation of college policy or procedure, the <b>Public Safety office</b> may be called.
